- d. **Satisfaction of Judgments.** Once a judgment has been satisfied by the payment of the monetary award, or the parties have entered into a new rental agreement or created a novation of the prior rental agreement, the party in whose favor the judgment was entered shall file a Satisfaction of Judgment with the court that entered it within thirty days after the judgment has been paid in full and serve a copy on the judgment debtor. The duty to file the satisfaction of judgment is on the prevailing party and not on the attorney who represented the party. In the event that a prevailing party fails to satisfy a judgment rendered ~~and cannot be located with a showing of reasonable diligence~~, the judgment debtor may file a motion to compel satisfaction of judgment and the court may, after an opportunity for a hearing, order that the judgment shall be deemed satisfied.

 - 1. Any party can file a motion with the court asking to be relieved from judgment. The motion does not affect the finality of the judgment or suspend operation of the judgment. The court may vacate the judgment for the following reasons:
 - 2. The judgment has been satisfied, released, or discharged; it is based on an earlier judgment that has been reversed or vacated; or applying it prospectively is no longer equitable; or
 - 3. Any other reason justifying relief.
