### RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT OF ARIZONA

#### Rule 34. Admission on Motion.

**(a)-(d) [No change]**

**~~(f)~~(e) Admission on Motion.<sup>2</sup>**

1. An ~~application~~ applicant who meets the requirements of (A) through (G) of this paragraph ~~(f)~~(1) may, upon motion be admitted to the practice of law in this jurisdiction.

The applicant shall:
