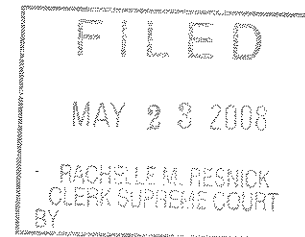



PETITION

9 Petitioner submits the following response to the Comment Opposing Petition filed by the
10 Arizona Department of Economic Security.

16 In its Comment, Arizona Department of Economic Security (AzDES) opposes the proposed
17 amendment to Rule 45 of the Rules of Procedure for the Juvenile Court (Rule 45). The reasons
18 advanced by AzDES are both legally and factually incorrect.

19 The Arizona Department of Economic Security (AzDES) states that “[t]he format in which
20 ADES provides its reports is not, and should not be, prescribed by the Arizona Supreme Court.”
21 (Comment at page 3.) To the extent that AzDES states that “[t]he format in which ADES
22 provides its reports is not . . . prescribed by the Arizona Supreme Court,” AzDES is legally
23 incorrect. Rule 45 prescribes the format that AzDES must follow in the reports that it provides
24 to the superior courts.

25 To the extent that AzDES states that “[t]he format in which ADES provides its reports
26 . . . should not be[] prescribed by the Arizona Supreme Court,” Petitioner and others disagree.
27 Attached as Attachment A are the signatures of 39 attorney who practice in juvenile court and
28 agree that the Arizona Supreme Court should adopt the proposed format changes.

1 AzDES contends that “[t]he format in which ADES provides its reports . . . should not be[]
2 prescribed by the Arizona Supreme Court” because AzDES has adopted its own format for the
3 reports subject to Rule 45. This raises the question of who should prescribe the report format:
4 the Arizona Supreme Court or AzDES? AzDES implemented its format change effective April 1,
5 2008, and although some caseworkers are using the new format (Attachment B, page 1), there
6 are numerous caseworkers who are not following the new format and are instead using the old
7 report format (Attachment C). If what controls the format is an AzDES policy, the trial courts
8 will have no way of seeing that the AzDES caseworkers follow the required format for court
9 reports. It thus appears that the Arizona Supreme Court should be the one to prescribe the
10 format for the court reports.

11 AzDES contends that the proposed changes to Rule 45 would be confusing and would
12 cause extra work for the caseworkers. To the contrary, it is the AzDES prescribed change that
13 is confusing and would cause extra work. Part of the AzDES file is the Foster Care Plan and
14 Report, and that section includes the following headings (see Attachment B, page 2, and
15 Attachment D):

16 **COURT WARDS INCLUDED IN THIS REPORT**
17 **SIBLINGS NOT INCLUDED IN THIS REPORT**

18 It should be noted that the information in those sections contains both the name and the date
19 of birth of each child. The proposed change to Rule 45 would require the following headings:

- 20 A. Name and date of birth of each court ward included in this report.
21 B. Name and date of birth of each sibling not included in this report.

22 The change in report form adopted by AzDES require the following headings (see Attachment
23 B, page 1):

- 24 A. Name and Date of Birth for Each Child Subject to This Court Case Number.
25 B. Child or Children Subject to This Report if Different From Above.

26 Thus the proposed change in Rule 45 tracks the language already used by AzDES in the Foster
27 Care Plan and Report section of the AzDES reports, while the change adopted by AzDES is
28 different form the language already used. The change adopted by AzDES is thus the one that
is confusing and will cause the extra work for the caseworkers.

1 An example of the confusion caused by the new AzDES format is shown in the May 14,
2 2008, report in JD16563 (Attachment E.) AzDES filed JD16563 in March 2008 alleging that Bryan
3 A., Lucia G., and Ruben J. were dependent children. In March 2008, the AzDES caseworker filed
4 a report covering those three children. Then in May 2008, AzDES filed a supplemental petition
5 alleging that Angel G., April G. and Patrick G. were dependent children. Thus as of May 14,
6 2008, all six children were subject to this court case number. (Attachment F.) Therefore, when
7 the caseworker prepared that report, he should have listed all six children in the section entitled
8 "Name and Date of Birth for Each Child Subject to This Court Case Number," and should have
9 listed Angel G., April G. and Patrick G. in the section entitled "Child or Children Subject to This
10 Report if Different From Above." Under the format proposed by Petitioner, the caseworker
11 would have listed Angel G., April G. and Patrick G. in the section entitled "Name and date of
12 birth of each court ward included in this report," and would have listed Bryan A., Lucia G., and
13 Ruben J. in the section entitled "Name and date of birth of each sibling not included in this
14 report." Because this latter arrangement is exactly what the AzDES caseworkers are already
15 doing in the Foster Care Plan and Report portion of the AzDES case file, it is more likely that
16 the caseworkers will understand what information they have to include in the court reports and
17 where to place that information.

18 The Comment submitted by AzDES contains the following:

19 1. The format change that ADES has implemented differs from the proposal in one
20 respect. The Petition would require the name and birth date "of each sibling not
21 included in th[e] report." (Petition, Attachment A.) Theoretically that would require
22 information regarding siblings who are not dependent (children placed with another
custodial parent, for example) or even adult siblings who are not parties to the
dependency. Including that information might add confusion, rather than alleviate it,
so it is not included in the current ADES report format.

23 (Comment at page 4, note 1; emphasis added.) As noted above, the Foster Care Plan and Report
24 portion of the AzDES file has a section for the following:

25 **SIBLINGS NOT INCLUDED IN THIS REPORT**

26 (See Attachment B, page 2, and Attachment D.) AzDES is thus factually incorrect when it states
27 that "that information . . . is not included in the current ADES report format."
28

1 AzDES contends that Petitioner filed the proposed change to Rule 45 after AzDES adopted
2 its change in format. AzDES is factually incorrect. In June 2007, Petitioner spoke to Ms. Linda
3 Johnson, the AzDES DCYF/Policy and Program Development Unit Manager, and told her he
4 was contemplating filing a rule change petition to require the names and dates of birth for the
5 children at the beginning of the court reports. Ms. Johnson said that AzDES could accomplish
6 this with a change in its report format. On July 3, Petitioner sent proposed changes to Ms.
7 Johnson. (Attachment G.) On August 13, Ms. Johnson responded by e-mail that she had received
8 those changes and that she would advise Petitioner of the projected completion date. (See
9 Attachment H, e-mail from Ms. Johnson dated Aug. 13, 2007.) By December 2007, Petitioner had
10 not heard from Ms. Johnson, so on December 19, Petitioner filed the proposed changes to Rule
11 45. On January 4, 2008, Petitioner sent an e-mail to Ms. Johnson with a copy of the Petition
12 attached and asking her of any thoughts she might have and if she knew what position AzDES
13 might take. (See Attachment H, e-mail to Ms. Johnson dated Jan. 4, 2008.) On January 7, Ms.
14 Johnson responded stating that AzDES was "now prioritizing other outstanding automation
15 requests," and that Petitioner's request was "among those being considered." (See Attachment
16 H, e-mail from Ms. Johnson dated Jan. 7, 2008.) Thus, AzDES did not even begin to consider
17 making changes to its report format until after Petitioner filed the request to amend Rule 45. And
18 it was not until the end of March 2008 that AzDES did adopt changes in its report format. (See
19 Attachment I, e-mail from Ms. Johnson dated Mar. 31, 2008.) Thus AzDES did not even consider
20 making a change to its report format until after Plaintiff had filed the petition to amend Rule 45.


21 AzDES contends that the Arizona Supreme Court should not change Rule 45 because
22 AzDES changed its report format and "these changes require[d] case management system re-
23 programming that require[d] many months to accomplish as the system is highly technical and
24 require[d] expertise to complete." The changes made by AzDES amounted to adding two lines
25 of text containing 25 words. (Compare Attachment B with Attachment C). Merely because
26 AzDES has chosen a word processing system that takes many months and expert assistance to
27 add 25 words to a report format should not be a valid reason to preclude the Arizona Supreme
28 Court from adopting a change that is supported by so many practitioners in the juvenile courts.

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CONCLUSION


The change proposed by Plaintiff would allow the AzDES caseworkers to use the same information in the court reports that they include in the Foster Case Plan and Report portion of the AzDES file. The change implemented by AzDES requires the caseworkers to use a different arrangement of data that will cause more work for the caseworkers. It therefore makes more sense to amend Rule 45 as suggested by Petitioner.

I. REASON FOR CPS INVOLVEMENT

A. Brief statement of grounds for petition.

On or around September 03, 2007, Rachel V [REDACTED] neglected Jenna, newborn and Sonya V [REDACTED], five years old. Mom failed to provide supervision, shelter, or medical care for the children and was unable to parent her children due to her abandonment of the children. Rachel has not been at her reported place of residence since 8-30-07. Jenna V [REDACTED] tested positive for cocaine and marijuana at birth. Jenna was suffering signs of withdrawal. Mom has a history of substance abuse.

Rachel entered into a safety plan with CPS and her sister, but after her discharge from the hospital, she stated that a friend was picking her up from the hospital and she would meet them at home and had not arrived at the time of the TDM.

Sonya was abandoned with her aunt, on or about 3 years ago. Sonya had broken her arm and due to mom's whereabouts being unknown, the aunt was unable to get medical care. Sonya could not see a Specialist needed to have the bone heal properly.

Maternal aunt states that Victor V [REDACTED] was taken by force from the family at a cousin's home during a visit by his bio-father, Albert J [REDACTED] about 5 years ago and mom never filed a police report or did anything to have him returned home with the family. Victor's whereabouts and welfare are unknown at this time.

Rachel's statement to Pearl was that she was not going to come home due to her concerns that the family will call police and have her arrested due to her outstanding warrants.

I. REASON FOR CPS INVOLVEMENT

A. Brief statement of grounds for petition.

On September 09, 2007, Child Protective Services (CPS), received a report regarding the newborn child of Lisa D■■■■■■■■■■ (aka M■■■■■■■■■■), Ray Joseph R■■■■■■■■■■ (DOB 09-06-01). The report stated that Lisa D■■■■■■■■■■ and Ray R■■■■■■■■■■ tested positive to amphetamines when Lisa D■■■■■■■■■■ gave birth to Ray R■■■■■■■■■■. The report also stated that Lisa D■■■■■■■■■■ had six (6) prenatal check-ups and tested positive six times for amphetamine throughout her pregnancy. According to the report this was Lisa D■■■■■■■■■■'s third (3rd) substance exposed newborn. The two previous children were born substance exposed on March 2004 and October 2000. Lisa D■■■■■■■■■■ had her parental rights severed as to three of her children in 2005. Her remaining children reside outside of Lisa D■■■■■■■■■■'s care with relatives.

Upon investigation, Lisa D■■■■■■■■■■ admitted to using methamphetamines one day prior to giving birth to the child, Ray Joseph R■■■■■■■■■■. Lisa D■■■■■■■■■■ admitted to using methamphetamines on and off for years. CPS found that Raymond R■■■■■■■■■■ had admitted to a history of experimenting with drugs. Raymond R■■■■■■■■■■ and Lisa D■■■■■■■■■■ had no permanent place to live and had not made provisions to care for their newborn child.

On September 09, 2007, CPS took temporary custody of Ray Joseph R■■■■■■■■■■, for his own protection via a Temporary Custody Notice (TCN). A Notice of Removal was served to the hospital on September 09, 2007. On September 10, 2007, a Team Decision Making Meeting was held. On 09-18-08 a Preliminary Protective Hearing was held. It was determined the child, Ray R■■■■■■■■■■, would remain in CPS custody and the family would participate in services.

The child was reported as wearing a "T" shirt and underwear only. This had been the fourth referral CPS had received on this family in less than five months. The referral alleged a variety of concerns, including neglect, abuse and lack of adequate supervision. On July 8, 1998, Stephan and his siblings were made Wards of the Court. CPS, on that same date, transferred Stephan A■■■■ to the Division of Developmental Disabilities.
